

# Hunt Oregon Gear List:

## Fall to Early Winter Hunts

These hunts take place when we are targeting animals in volatile weather conditions ranging from 70-degree days to snowy and below freezing temperatures, the gear lists is as follows:

### **Essentials:**

- Tag and License
  - Contact management or your guide as some tags are over the counter, while others must be applied for by May 15<sup>th</sup> of the year you are hunting. License is over the counter.
- Rifle
  - Sighted prior to the hunt at either 100 or 200 yards (your preference), though we can check at our gun range on arrival. Minimum .270 caliber for elk and .243 for deer.
- Ammunition
  - Bring sufficient amount of ammo, we ask you to bring a full box (20 rounds).
- Insulated hiking boots
- Proper fitted neutral (nothing solid white/black) or camouflage clothing including:
  - Jackets
  - Sweatshirts
  - Pants
  - Warm layering shirts
- Wool or wool-blend socks
- Binoculars
- Toiletries
  - Toothbrush/paste, deodorant, shower supplies
- Day Pack
- Hat
  - Beanie if it is cooler, ball caps are always a great way to keep the sun out of your face
- Gloves
- Coolers

- Minimum size 150qt x2 for a cow elk, 200qt x2 for bulls. Bucks can be fit into 1 200qt cooler.

## **Non-Essentials:**

- Hearing protection
- Shooting Sticks/bipods
- Spotting Scope
- Trekking Poles
- Raingear
  - Check weather the week prior to arrival or message your guide.
- Pack Frame
  - We generally can drive close to the animals to load them, however on occasion they expire in a location that requires packing.
- Knife
  - Your guide will field dress and skin your animal, though if you would like to assist, we suggest bringing a knife. This can also be a useful tool in general.
- Headlamp/flashlights
- Game Bags
  - Quarter bags are not required but are helpful.
- OnX or other GPS system
  - Your guide is aware of property boundaries, though if you would like to use the system you are welcome to.
- Water bottle or Camelbak
  - We will provide water bottles, though you are welcome to bring your own.
